



Acree Update, May 2016



Dear Praying Friends,

During this time in Ghana, one of our principle ministries is going out on visitation. I am able to go out witnessing multiple times during the week, and Melissa is able to go out on Saturday afternoons. We pass out tracts and invite people to church, but the most exciting and enjoyable privilege is that we are able to hold 'Salvation Bible Studies'. Instead of leading someone through a rushed rendition of the Romans Road, we try to sit with individuals (or small groups) over an extended period of time and present the gospel to them in such a way that some of their previous false indoctrination and misconceived ideas are (hopefully) laid to rest. The result is that some have made a genuine profession of faith that results in faithful church attendance and a change in lifestyles. A young man named Prince is the most recent to finish the Salvation Bible Study and make a profession, and we are in the midst of the study with several others (Kwame, Richard, Frederick and Gideon to name a few).

The missionary family that we are working with has started a guitar class so that members of the church can learn to accompany the song service after they leave for their next furlough. Joel and I are taking advantage of this so that we will be prepared to do the same whenever we launch out to begin our first church plant.

At the beginning of the year, we moved from Tema to Kumasi for an opportunity to more fully learn and immerse ourselves in the language. We have been pleased with how much more exposure to Twi we are receiving as we go into the community for shopping, visitation and the like. Additionally, we have resumed formal Twi lessons with a private tutor, but we are already accomplished enough to graduate from that to hiring a conversationalist. Melissa already has some ladies that she will meet with weekly just to converse, but I have yet to find someone.

Incidentally, when someone moves, they typically get a new mailing address. So it is with us and our address is as seen below. I would also like to point out at this time that if someone desires to send us a package (anything larger than a small padded envelope), they should contact us first for instructions as customs could charge up to 70% of the value of its contents.
