I love sharing with them we have the job to go to a foreign country to tell others about Christ. At that moment the Lady became very uncomfortable because she realized who I was. She did not take a tract when we were at the door. However, I was able to leave a tract with the gentlemen and her this time.

We have received a little more info on our Permit situation. Trinidad is really tightening down on letting missionaries in Trinidad. They now are requiring a copy of my college diploma. The government says they are becoming more stringent as they found some people were coming in under missionary permits just to live in the country. So now they want to see evidence of special training in missions. Please continue to pray for this matter, and our quick return to Trinidad and Tobago.

We thank you for your continued prayer and financial support. After some recent changes we are now around of our 70% support. We ask for continued prayer for our meetings, support, and visa process.
