Planting Churches in BELIZE , CENTRAL AMERICA



Dear Partners in Ministry,

The seed has been planted. The sapling has begun to take root. It is a critical time in the life of a church plant. In Patchakan, the men are beginning to learn that their church functions smoother when they get involved. We have groups of people passing out tracts every Saturday. A family which used to sit in their home waiting for me to pick them up in the church van have begun to walk in order to stop and encourage neighbors to come to church with them. This is the time that a church plant is very vulnerable to attacks from the enemies of God. **This church family needs a Pastor. I will specifically request that you pray that The Lord will give wisdom in the search for a qualified Pastor.** Ideally, He will call one of the men from the village, but only God knows at this point who is going to fill that role.

As church planters, we lead busy lives. In Belize, one cannot hope to plant a solid work without some amount of involvement in the community. As you know, we are in process of planting two churches simultaneously, one English and one Spanish. In addition to inviting people to our five church services per week, in the last ten days, I have performed a wedding; was invited to three graduation ceremonies in the public schools, (and spoke as guest of honor at one of them); and hosted a talented group of 29 youth from Temple Baptist Church in Texas.

Thank you for praying about my feet. I have not had any problems with the swelling and pain in several months. Pray for Angie. She has lowered immune systems because of her bout with cancer, and is sick with the flu even as I write this to you. And, as always,
