## Greetings in Jesus name!

The last quarter of 2018 was quite an eventful one for the Jalowiec Family!

We traveled most of the month of September, and October brought the arrival of our first grandson!

In November, Dan traveled to Zambia and had a wonderful reunion with the churches and families there. Pastor Gwese has done a tremendous job ministering in my absence, and has grown our outreach to include seven more preaching points! Truly the harvest is plenteous! We are praying how best to minister and know the Lord has great plans for these new works.

I traveled to Zambia with Justin and Mandy Bedwell, who are on a 14 month internship. They are working along side us, and have already had several challenges and victories! They traveled across the country to join a youth camp, and we had 28 youth from our ministry area in attendance. Youth camp is always a time to propel people forward, and this was no exception! We have heard wonderful testimonies, and know the Lord did a great work there!

This is also the rainy season in Zambia, and it has been fierce! Pastor Gwese's house was flooded as a result of a deluge that brought a raging river full of debris and pollutants through their home. They were forced to move, and lost quite a bit of their personal belongings. We praise God no one was hurt, and that they were able to find another home.

I was thrilled to find the Churches doing well! Msekera, Big Tree and Chikoka have all maintained and even grown in our absence, and we praise the Lord for his faithfulness to these precious people!

We are planning, preparing and praying about our return to Zambia in March. We have a team of 9 coming shortly after we return, and will hit the ground running.

While furlough is a time of reporting to and reconnecting with our supporting churches and families, it is also a time to reflect on the work and pray for new vision for the future. We have seen a huge need for quality and doctrinally sound printed Bible teaching in the Chichewa language. Pastor Gwese and I have been translating much of our teaching, and also paring it down to be concise and free of any cultural influences. Just Bible!

We are systematically going through these courses with each preaching point, essentially conducting Mobile Bible Institute! Wanting to be wise with the resources God has provided, it has become clear that printing our own materials will be much more time and cost effective. While this brings a whole new learning curve with it, we are excited to move forward with this. Sourcing a quality printer is our first order of business, and then researching binding options. We are excited at the doors this will open up, as well as the lives that will be impacted with the Life changing message of the Gospel!

We have a few months left this side of the globe, and await the arrival of our third grandson sometime in February. We are so thankful for the time we have had stateside, and having spent the Christmas season with our family has been an absolute joy.

Thank you All for your continued prayers and support for our family and our ministry as we Bring the message that Jesus Saves to Zambia!

### Project Outreach

We are thrilled to partner with a stateside 501c3, Grace and Truth International, and through them we are able to receive funds for large Compassion projects and humanitarian efforts. We are currently raising funds for two projects.

Chiziye Secondary School has a desperate need for Student Housing. Over 200 students stay at the school throughout the week, and are currently sleeping in the classrooms.

Chinunda Health clinic is a rural medical center that provides health care for a catchment area of over 10,000 people. They need housing for an ambulance driver so the people can have reliable medical transportation into town.
