Our two big kids were able to attend youth camp and my eldest will be competing the National Student’s Convention (NSC) in Roxas City next week. We were able to renew also all of our passports.

In the other hand, we felt sorry for the young congregation and ministries we left in Sri Lanka while we’re having our furlough. By the grace of God, the believers there continue worshiping the Lord. I heard some good news and bad news also. Good news is that there are believers waiting for me to get baptized. Bad news is that some believers stop serving the Lord. I really appreciate the labour and sacrifice of Dr. Achchuthan, (my son in the faith) who is taking care of the ministry in my absence.

I really appreciate my wife that even in her busy days in taking care of our four children’s schooling she was able to teach the children in our neighbourhood in Caloocan every Saturday morning. One of the blessings we knew is that one of the children in her good news class during our deputation time is now a member of a church in Bible Baptist Church of Caloocan with her mother and she is now 15 years old.

Our departure back for Sri Lanka will be on October 31, 2014, God willing. Please pray for us, as we enter again our battle field where Satan’s seat is. I believe the devil and his angels are not happy that we are coming back. I really thank those churches who gave their increase in their giving for Sri Lankan missions, upon seeing the need and progress of the work. Praise His glorious name!
