



**Third Quarter Prayer Letter**

**June 2019**

Dear Praying Friends,

Our summer schedule is in full swing here at Medical Missions Outreach! We currently have a team of 53 volunteers serving with national pastors in Nyahururu, Kenya. This is one of our favorite locations and we are anticipating many souls to be saved through our medical, dental, and vision clinics.

In May, our team headed to Romania to work alongside veteran missionary Brent George. Our team of 42 volunteers worked in a small village serving the Romani (gypsy) population. Of the 1,112 patients that came through the clinic, three previous souls trusted Christ. Many others wanted home visits to discuss salvation in greater detail. Was it worth it for three souls?!? Yes!

Earlier this month, our optical team worked with missionary Adam Fridenstein in Cojutepeque, El Salvador. Our group of 29 volunteers were able to treat 1475 patients. The people of Emanuel Baptist Church shared the gospel with each patient that came through, and praise the Lord for the 316 souls that accepted Christ! One particular patient, an elderly lady from the church, immediately praised the Lord for her new glasses because she could finally read God's Word clearly after several years of difficulty. What a blessing to see her excitement!

While the MMO team worked in El Salvador, the Edmondson family took a small team to Honduras to add finishing touches on the Rearick Surgical Center. Even the children helped! We have been so blessed to have three other teams volunteer their time and talents to the RSC. They have organized supplies, installed cabinets, assembled furniture, hung fixtures, and along with a myriad of other things, have made the RSC almost functional! We are thrilled with the progress and anticipate the day when we can start providing surgical care to patients from all over Central America.

As MMO continues to grow, we have added more staff to our team. Miss Hannah Bender, RN, arrived in June and is settling in to her new role as Director of Educational Services. Hannah has a passion for teaching and her duties will involve preparing students for mission work, as well as managing patient education on the field. Please pray for Hannah's transition to Baltimore and for her monthly support. Hannah left her full-time job to join MMO and relies on monthly support to travel on 10 trips annually. We are blessed to have her on our team.

Josh Berg has also recently joined our staff as Director of Media. Josh and his wife Rachel will be relocating to Baltimore from Pennsylvania this summer. Josh will develop our promotional videos and brochures, and will run our social media. Please pray for the Bergs as they move here with three small children to do His work!

Earlier this year, our home church, Rosedale Baptist Church, graciously allowed us to upgrade our warehouse and office property by "swapping" our current property with a property that they owned. This is a bigger, better location for MMO. A work team from Grace Baptist Church in Brunswick, Ohio, has already sent crews to assess and start demolition work. We are thrilled with the progress and plan to for this project to take less than 2 years.

Lastly, we are so excited to announce that the college students of Pensacola Christian College had a missions fundraiser for MMO this spring. The students raised over \$30,000 for MMO to purchase land for a new clinic in Tanzania! Missionary Jerry Wyatt and the people of Faith Baptist Church in Morogoro, Tanzania will work in conjunction with MMO to minister to their local community and show the love of Christ.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support. We know that the Lord uses His people to accomplish His plan. Thank you for making it all possible! Please join us on a trip- we need you!
